3. Do you think that society is better now (1959) than it was 100 years ago? Why or why not?
4. What kind of improvements do you think that there have been?
5. What kind of improvements do you think that there should be?
6. If you had the power to change society's mind and make them see you differently, what would you do?
7. What can you do personally to help change people's minds and make this country a better place?
8. The argument could be made that you have the same opportunities as the other people. The only difference is you must make those opportunities in a different location. Separate but equal. Do you agree with this? Why or why not?
9. If you could talk to your future family many years from now, what do you think they would say about their current conditions? Would they say it is better or worse and why would they say that?
